	Covered California	<ul> <li>Legal residents</li> <li>Subsidies for low-income households (&lt;400% FPL)</li> </ul>
Healthy	Healthy San Francisco	<ul> <li>Uninsured adults within low-income households who do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Covered California (&lt;500% FPL)</li> </ul>

#### **Pre-ACA Programs that are continuing**

- Medi-Cal for Seniors (65+) and Persons w/ Disabilities
  - Asset and Resource Rules for eligibility
  - Income level determines 'share of cost'
- Healthy San Francisco (Adults 18-64)
  - Uninsured adults within low-income households who do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Covered California
  - Health Insurance is better then Healthy SF
- Healthy Kids (Children up to age 18)
  - Uninsured children within low-income households who do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Covered California
  - Health insurance is better then Healthy Kids

#### **Health Reform: Ten Minimum Essential Benefits**

Beginning January 1, 2014 all health insurance must include ten minimum essential benefits:

- 1. Ambulatory Patient Services
- 2. Emergency Services
- 3. Hospitalization
- 4. Maternity and Newborn Care
- 5. Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment
- 6. Prescription Drugs
- 7. Rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices
- 8. Laboratory Services
- 9. Preventive and wellness services and chronic disease management
- 10. Pediatric services, including oral and vision care

### **CalFresh Express Lane Enrollment (ELE)**

- Beginning Feb 2014 individuals enrolled in CalFresh are categorically eligible to Medi-Cal
- Eligible individuals should have received a letter with instructions on how to enroll and a mandatory PIN
  - Website (http://www.dhcs.ca.gov/pages/ExpressLane)
  - Phone number for HCO (M-F, 8am 5pm at 1-844-212-0003)
  - Mail the 'Join Medi-Cal Form' using the postage paid envelope provided with the letter
- If they did not receive, or lost, the letter contact SF Human Services Agency at 1-877-366-3076.

#### **Former Foster Youth**

- Former Foster Youth are eligible for Medi-Cal if they:
  - Were in foster care in ANY state at age 18,
  - Currently live in California, AND
  - Are under the age of 26
- Regardless of income
- One page application
- Enrolled in Medi-Cal through age 26
- Youth aging out of Foster Care today will automatically be enrolled in the Former Foster Youth Medi-Cal program

- New and affordable options for health coverage are here for every San Franciscan!
- If you qualify, health insurance is better than Healthy San Francisco or Healthy Kids
- If you do not qualify, Healthy San Francisco and Healthy Kids will be here for you
