

#### **Prescription Painkiller Sales and Deaths**





1939	The California Triplicate Prescription Program (TPP) was created, capturing Schedule II prescription information.	
1997	CURES was initiated, operating in parallel with the TPP's Automated Triplicate Prescription System (ATPS) to evaluate the comparative efficiencies between the two systems.	
2005	TPP/ATPS decommissioned after Senate Bill 151 eliminated	
	the triplicate prescription requirement for Schedule II controlled substances, making CURES permanent. Schedule III	
	controlled substance prescription reporting became required.	
2007	Schedule IV controlled substance prescription reporting became required.	
2009	PDMP was introduced as a searchable, client-facing component of CURES.	
2011	The Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement dissolved and the CURES Program was de-funded.	

## CURES 2.0 Relevant Provisions of Law

Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) & Attendant Regulations 42 U.S.C. §§ 1320d to 1320d-8, and 45 CFR 164, et seq.

California Confidentiality of Medical Information Act CA Civil Code §§ 56 to 56.16

California Information Practices Act CA Civil Code § 1798, et seq.

CURES Legislation

CA Health and Safety Code § 11165, et seq.



## CURES System and Requirements

Pharmacies and dispensers are required to report dispensations of Schedules II through IV controlled substances to DOJ at least weekly.

California Healthy & Safety Code section 11165(d)

Presently, the database contains over 230 million entries of controlled substance prescriptions dispensed in California.

In order to reflect exactly what dispensers report to DOJ, the department does not touch or modify dispenser-reported data.

## CURES 2.0 cures System and Requirements

Access to CURES is restricted to:

Licensed prescribers and licensed pharmacists strictly for patients in their direct care

Law enforcement for criminal investigatory purposes

Regulatory boards for oversight and disciplinary purposes

California Healthy & Safety Code section 11165(a)

## CURES 2.0 cures System and Requirements

On Sept. 27, 2013, Senate Bill 809 passed requiring prescribers and pharmacists to *apply* for CURES access.

A health care practitioner authorized to prescribe, order, administer, furnish, or dispense Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV controlled substances...shall, before January 1, 2016, or upon receipt of a federal DEA registration, whichever occurs later, submit an application to obtain approval to access CURES.

\*\*California Healthy & Safety Code section 11165.1 (a)(1)(A)(i)

A pharmacist shall, before January 1, 2016, or upon licensure, whichever occurs later, submit an application to obtain approval to access CURES.

California Healthy & Safety Code section 11165.1 (a)(1)(A)(ii)

Use of CURES by prescribers and dispensers for prescription abuse prevention/intervention is *voluntarily*.

CURES 2.0 Soft Launch and Phased Rollout

The Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) are pleased to announce that the state's new Controlled Substance Utilization Review and Evaluation System – commonly referred to as "CURES 2.0" – will go live on July 1, 2015. This upgraded prescription drug monitoring program features a variety of performance improvements and added functionality.

In order to ensure a smooth transition from the current system, CURES 2.0 will be rolled out to users in phases over the next several months, beginning with early adoption by a select group of users who currently use CURES and meet the CURES 2.0 security standards, including minimum browser specifications.\*\* DOJ is currently identifying prescribers and dispensers who meet these criteria and will contact and coordinate their enrollment into CURES 2.0. For all other current users, access to CURES 1.0 will not change and no action is needed at this time. For users and entities not currently enrolled in CURES, further notification will be provided in August as to the enrollment/registration process.

Practitioners and health systems should begin to prepare for universal adoption of the system by January 2016, at which point all users will be required to meet CURES 2.0's security standards. If you have any questions please contact cures@doj.ca.gov.




### **CURES 2.0 Registration**




Applicant receives an email with instructions and link to the Registration page.

The email link is valid for 90 days.

CA licensees will no longer need to notarize and mail paper applications.



### **CURES 2.0 Registration**



Approved users are sent an Email with their User ID and link to validate identification.

Then the user is sent an email with their Temporary Password.

Upon first-time login, the user must reset their Password and complete their profile.

### **CURES 2.0 Features**

### <u>Delegates</u>

Prescribers and dispensers register delegates and assume responsibility for delegates' use of CURES 2.0.

Delegates may initiate PAR searches on behalf of their "Parent" prescriber or dispenser.

Prescribers and dispensers may have several delegates. And delegates can support several prescribers and dispensers.

Delegates are deleted when they have not been associated with any CURES users for 30 days or if the delegate has not logged into CURES for 12 months.

### **CURES 2.0 Features**

### **Compacts**

Providers can flag patients within CURES 2.0 with whom they have an exclusivity compact. Users can view if a compact exists for a patient.

#### Peer-to-Peer Communication


Users can view prescriber contact information on PAR Details pages. Prescribers and dispensers can send messages to prescribers within CURES 2.0.

Contact information is based on CURES enrollment.

### **CURES 2.0 Features**



#### **Alerts**

Based on patterns indicative of at-risk patient behavior.

Alerts are informational and providers must determine if any action is necessary.




### **CURES 2.0 Features**

#### **Alerts**

- 1. Currently prescribed more than 100 mme per day.
- 2. Obtained prescriptions from 6 or more prescribers or pharmacies in the last 6 months.
- 3. Currently prescribed 40 or more mme of Methadone daily.
- 4. Currently prescribed Opioids more than 90 consecutive days.
- 5. Currently prescribed both Benzodiazepines and Opioids.



### **CURES 2.0 Self-Service**




Password resets are required every 90 days.
