San Francisco Health Plan will be upgrading our data center from Thursday, April 9th at 6:00pm through Monday, April 13th at 8:00am

During the upgrade, SFHP offices will be closed, and all network connectivity will be inaccessible. This includes:

- All Provider Portal and network connections
- All office phone connectivity, including call forwarding
- Email and faxes

Emails, phone messages, and faxes cannot be received by SFHP during the outage.

We sincerely regret this inconvenience. We will monitor the maintenance work closely and will restore the systems as soon as our upgrade is complete.

Mandatory Cultural Awareness and Sensitivity Training

Pharmacy Update

Medication Therapy Management

Effective **November 1, 2014,** San Francisco Health Plan contracted with OutcomesMTM[™] to offer Medication Therapy Management (MTM) services to Medi-Cal Seniors and Persons with Disabilities members. OutcomesMTM identifies, specially trained Personal Pharmacists in communities throughout San Francisco to deliver these services. By using an OutcomesMTM Pharmacist, members get the extra attention they need to keep their medications on the right track. MTM services may be available face-toface or via phone. Services offered to members include Comprehensive Medication Review, prescriber or non-prescription consultation and drug information. Doxycycline

Effective **January 21, 2015,** doxycycline HYCLATE 50 mg capsules, 100 mg capsules and 100 mg tablets were removed from SFHP formulary. Preferred doxycycline formulations will be doxycycline MONOHYDRATE 50 mg capsules, 100 mg capsules and 100 mg tablets. Members currently using doxycycline HYCLATE formulations will be grandfathered on their existing regimen until further notice. Makena

Hydroxyprogesterone caproate (Makena®) will now be available effective **January 13**, **2015** in both the pharmacy and medical benefits. Hydroxyprogesterone caproate is used to reduce the risk of preterm birth in pregnant females 16 years of age or older. For this drug to be covered as either a medical or pharmacy benefit, prior authorization criteria must be met. In the pharmacy benefit, it is restricted to SFHP's specialty pharmacy, US Bioservices. Please contact US Bioservices at (888) 518-7246 for any questions or to transfer a prescription.

SFHP's specialty drug list is reviewed monthly and updated to reflect market changes.
