1. Advance Care Planning now a Medi-Cal Benefit

Two new advance care planning codes were introduced in 2015:

- 99497 Advance Care Planning by the physician or other qualified health care professional; first 30 minutes, face-to-face.
- 99498 For each additional 30 minutes.

Effective immediately, and for service(s) dated back to November 1, 2015, Medi-Cal covers these services separately from usual visit codes. Please use these codes to indicate when you have provided and documented this service for your patients in advance care planning.

2. New FSR Resources on Our Website

The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) requires all Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans to conduct a Full Scope Facility Site Review (FSR), including Medical Record Review (MRR), of all Primary Care Provider sites as part of the initial credentialing process and at least every three years thereafter.

5. Pharmacy Updates

Zepatier

- Effective March 4, 2016, new Hepatitis C medication Zepatier (elbasvir and grazoprevir) can only be filled at SFHP's Specialty Pharmacy, US Bioservices. For any questions or to call in a prescription, please contact US Bioservices at 1(888) 518-7246 or 1(866) 223-7914 for Hepatitis C disease specific phone line.
- SFHP's specialty drug list is reviewed and updated regularly to reflect market changes. Please visit SFHP <u>website</u> to view current specialty drug list and summary of recent changes.
- As a reminder, SFHP uses the mandated California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Hepatitis C Treatment Policy for all Hepatitis C requests. DHCS Hepatitis C Treatment Policy can be found <u>here</u>.

Formulary and Prior Authorization (PA) Criteria Changes

- Changes to the SFHP formulary and prior authorization criteria have been approved by the SFHP Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Committee in January 2016.
- Important changes include the following:
 - Oxybutynin ER added to formulary; tolterodine, tolterodine ER, trospium and trospium ER added to formulary with step therapy requirement for oxybutynin
 - Arnuity Ellipta® inhaler and Asmanex® HFA inhaler added to formulary
 - o Rifapentene (Priftin®) added to formulary
 - Metformin ER 750 mg tablet added to formulary
 - Revisions made to existing PA criteria (e.g. biologic medications, enteral nutrition products, dronabinol, etc) and 25 new PA criteria approved

Home Blood Pressure Monitors

SFHP is providing care support for Medi-Cal members and members with both Medi-Cal and Medicaid with hypertension by providing easy access to home blood pressure monitors through the pharmacy benefit. Effective **February 19, 2016**, SFHP is covering three preferred blood pressure monitors: Omron 3, 5 and 10 Series.

- The Omron 3 Series is easy and portable
- The Omron 5 Series is also portable and can monitor blood pressure for 2 family members
- The Omron 10 series supports the monitoring needs of your complex hypertension patients

Members can obtain one Omron 3, 5 and 10 Series blood pressure monitor every five years at their local pharmacy. Prior authorization is needed for all other blood pressure

monitors explaining why Omron Series blood pressure monitors cannot be used.

Doxycycline Hyclate

Effective **March 17, 2016**, doxycycline hyclate 100 mg capsule and tablet have been added to SFHP formulary with a quantity limit of #2 per day. Doxycycline monohydrate 50 mg capsule and 100 mg capsule and tablet are remaining on formulary with a quantity limit of 2 per day.

8. CURES Important Reminder

By July 1, 2016 all physicians who are authorized to prescribe, order, administer, furnish or dispense Schedules II, III, or IV controlled substances MUST BE registered with the CURES system (Controlled Substance Utilization Review and Evaluation System).

The California Medical Association is hosting a webinar with the Department of Justice to provide an overview of the registration process and key features of the newly upgraded system.
