Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Substance Use (FUA)

The percentage of emergency department (ED) visits among members age 13 years and older with a principal diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD), or any diagnosis of drug overdose, for which there was follow-up. Two rates are reported:

Measure

The percentage of ED visits for which the member received follow-up within 30 days of the ED visit (31 total days).

Numerators

30-Day Follow-Up A follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event within 30 days after the ED visit (31 total days). Include visits and pharmacotherapy events that occur on the date of the FD visit.

The percentage of

ED visits for which the member received follow-up within 7 days of the ED visit (8 total days).

7-Day Follow-Up

A follow-up visit or a pharmacotherapy dispensing event within 7 days after the ED visit (8 total days). Include visits and pharmacotherapy events that occur on the date of the ED visit.

Follow-Up Visits Coding

Substance Use Disorder Diagnosis F10-F16, F18, F19

Drug Overdose Diagnosis T40-T43, T51
