

Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life (W30)

The percentage of members who had the following number of well-child visits with a PCP during the last 15 months. The following rates are reported:

2 Well-child visits for age 15 months–30 months. Children who turned 30 months old during the measurement year: two or more well-child visits.	Two or more well-child visits on different dates of service between the child's 15-month birthday plus 1 day and the 30-month birthday. The well-child visit must occur with a PCP, but the PCP does not have to be the practitioner assigned to the child.	

Notes

- The codes set above are used by HEDIS to determine compliance. Not all codes are necessarily covered by Medi-Cal.
- Synchronous telehealth visits count towards compliance.



- Visits for the following diagnoses may potentially be coded as well-child visits if meeting all other criteria for a well-child visit:
