

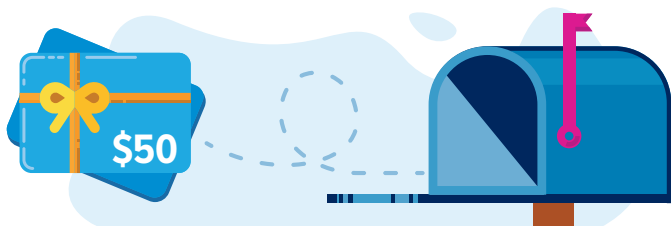


Child Developmental Screenings

Developmental milestones are activities that kids can usually do by a certain age, for example how a child plays, learns, speaks, or moves. All young kids need developmental screenings so that you, their doctors, and their teachers know if your child needs extra support.

Get \$50 for your child's first developmental screening

All kids ages 0 months to 36 months (3 years) should get developmental screenings. You can get a \$50 gift card after you bring your child to their first developmental screening. You will automatically get a \$50 gift card in the mail from San Francisco Health Plan (SFHP)! You do not have to fill out any forms to get the gift card.

You must have your health visit by the end of the year to get the gift card. The gift card will be mailed to you 8 weeks after your visit. If you have moved recently, please call SFHP Customer Service to update your address to make sure you get your reward. If you have yet to get your gift card after 8 weeks, please call SFHP Customer Service.

What happens at a developmental screening?

At a screening, your child will get a short test. Or you will fill out a survey about your child. It asks questions about how your child speaks, moves, thinks, and shows their feelings. This test helps to find out if your child needs more support. If it is needed, the extra support will help your child be as healthy as they can be.
