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1. Introducing: SFHP Acupuncturists

As a reminder, please note the following:

- Prior authorization(PA) is not required before the member's first visit to the
 acupuncturist; however, the acupuncture provider may ask the referring/primary
 care office to submit a PA request form and obtain approval before they see the
 patient (for example, UCSF Osher Center can accept referrals, but they should
 ask for you to request prior authorization for their services when the patient is not
 seeing a UCSF PCP).
- Please contact the acupuncture office to make sure they will take adults in SFHP's Medi-Cal program before requesting authorization. If you need help finding a provider for the member, please contact SFHP for a current list of contracted providers.
- Acupuncture is only a covered benefit for SFHP's Medi-Cal. At this time, it is not a covered benefit for Healthy Workers or Healthy Kids plan members.
- Authorizations are approved for a period of one year starting on the first date of service. There is a maximum of 24 visits allowed per year, to be scheduled at the acupuncture practitioner's discretion. Any additional visits need to be requested as a modification to the approved authorization with progress notes and medical necessity justification.
- Additional information on the Medi-Cal acupuncture benefit, including covered service codes, can be found in the "<u>Acupuncture Services</u>" Medi-Cal provider manual available on the Medi-Cal website.



4. Facility Site Review (FSR) Provider Pearls: TB Risk Assessment

As a Primary Care Provider (PCP) for SFHP members, the periodic Medical Record Review (MRR) includes auditing that TB screening is well-documented and is demonstrated as a consistent practice. The California Tuberculosis Risk Assessment and Fact Sheet (Adults) was presented at the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) Medical Directors meeting in January 2017. This is endorsed by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) and California Department of Public Health (CA-DPH). It is a simple tool to assess who is considered at increased risk for testing.

Members testing positive should be referred to the San Francisco Department of Public Health's TB Control Unit for consultation, screening, and evaluation. Additionally, the <u>San Francisco TB Control Unit</u> provides trained personnel to assist SFHP members requiring direct observed therapy (DOT) services. The program provides, delivers, and directly observes the ingestion of prescribed of anti-TB medications for patients with active TB who meet one of the following criteria:

- Individuals with demonstrated multiple drug resistance (INH and Rifampin)
- Individuals whose treatment has failed or has relapsed post treatment
- Individuals with significant functional impairment due to mental illness or substance abuse
- Children and adolescents
- HIV-positive individuals
- Individuals hospitalized with active TB
- Homeless individuals
- Individuals who fail to keep appointments

Elderly individuals, persons with language and/or cultural barriers, individuals with memory or cognitive disorders, and those too ill for self-management can also be referred.

Medical groups and PCPs should forward medical records, consultation reports, and appropriate laboratory findings to the TB Control Unit. SFHP members eligible for DOT services remain enrolled with SFHP. The medical group and PCP maintain responsibility for coordination of services and for continued medical care. 7. Free One Hour Online Training: Acute Pain Management

We are announcing an online learning experience developed by the San Francisco Safety Net Pain Management Workgroup, San Francisco Health Plan, and Quality Healthcare Concepts.

Learning Objectives

 Practice an evidence-based approach to using opioids to treat acute pain that puts opioids into a "Risks vs. Benefits" framework.

- Understand the inherent risks of initiating opioids.
- Recognize the need to prevent escalation to long-term opioid use with its potential complications.
- Carefully consider other alternatives before prescribing opioids for acute pain, especially non-surgical acute pain.
- If you prescribe opioids, use the lowest dose and shortest duration that promote restored function.
- Acquire new strategies useful in your conversations with acute pain patients.

8. Pharmacy Update

Medi-Cal Formulary Tier Structure Changes

Effective March 22, 2017, SFHP has updated the formulary tier structure for Medi-Cal line of business pursuant to <u>California Assembly Bill No. 399, Chapter 619</u> on Health care coverage: outpatient prescription drugs.

The following tier structure now applies to SFHP Medi-Cal formulary:

Tier	Definition	Description
T1	Formulary Drug, Generic (can have quantity limits, age, gender and other code 1 restrictions)	Drug is a generic and is covered at point of sale if quantity limits, age, gender, and other code 1 restrictions are met (NOTE: If quantity limits, age, gender, and other code 1 restrictions are not met, drug may still be covered through Prior Authorization process).
T2	Formulary Drug, Brand (can have quantity limits, age, gender and other code 1 restrictions)	Drug is a brand and is covered at point of sale if quantity limits, age, gender, and other code 1 restrictions are met (NOTE: If quantity limits, age, gender, and other code 1 restrictions are not met, drug may still be covered through Prior Authorization process).
Т3	Formulary Drug, Step Therapy or Prior Authorization required	Drug is a brand or generic and is covered through Prior Authorization process or at point of sale if step therapy criteria are met

T4 Formulary Specialty Drug, Drug requires distribution through a **specialty pharmacy**Prior Authorization
required process is required.

Drug is non-formulary, provided through a medical benefit or excluded. Non-formulary drugs may be covered through Prior Authorization process. Excluded drugs (e.g. carve-outs) are not covered.

T5 Non-Formulary Drug covered

Tier updates to the remaining lines of business (i.e. Healthy Kids, Healthy Workers, Healthy San Francisco, and Medicare/Medi-Cal) are currently under way and will be live over the next several months. This update does not impact how medications are currently processing at point of sale and SFHP members are not affected by this change. Above tier definitions are listed in the searchable and printable Medi-Cal formulary available on the SFHP website.
