# **Facility Site Review Provider Pearls**



Intimate Partner Violence (IPV)

The 2022 California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) All Plan Letter (APL) 22-017, Primary Care Provider Site Reviews: Facility Site Review and Medical Record Review, includes a standard on intimate partner violence. This is a U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) B recommendation that clinicians screen for IPV among women of reproductive age and provide or refer women who screen positive to ongoing support services. The term "intimate partner violence" describes physical, sexual, or psychological harm by a current or former partner or spouse. This type of violence can occur among heterosexual or same-sex couples and does not require sexual intimacy.

The standard states:

- Per the USPSTF, clinicians shall screen for Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) on asymptomatic women of reproductive age, which is defined across studies as ranging from 12 to 49 years, with most research focusing on women aged 18 years or older. Examples of validated screening tools may include the following: Humiliation, Afraid, Rape, Kick (HARK) o Hurt, Insult, Threaten, Scream (HITS), Extended–Hurt, Insult, Threaten, Scream (E-HITS) or Partner Violence Screen (PVS), Woman Abuse Screening Tool (WAST)
- 2. For members who screen positive, providers should either provide or refer them to ongoing support services. Domestic and Family Violence Resources
